MFMC Jr. musicians can compete at 3 levels based on minimum Festival Class:

- **Advanced Summer Music Centers, \$1,000**
(Piano-Very Difficult; Other instruments-Difficult; Voice-Senior III)
- **Piano Discoveries Camp at the University of Mississippi, full tuition**
(Piano-Difficult)
- **Music Camp at Mississippi College, full tuition**
(Piano-Medium; Voice-Junior III)

General Rules

1. All applicants must be members of the Mississippi Federation of Music Clubs Junior Division, regular or Individual Members.
2. All entrants auditioning for scholarships at State Junior Convention must be prepared to perform both pieces (required and choice) played in festival try-outs. One score for each piece must be provided for judges. Photocopying is prohibited.
3. If only one applicant meets requirements on festival level from over the entire state, he/she must still audition at the annual State Junior Convention.
4. NO applicant is declared a winner until the Junior Convention.
5. NO travel expense to camp is provided by MFMC.
6. NO private lessons are paid for by MFMC.
7. Applicants' records must be carefully checked by District Festival Chairmen for eligibility before district auditions and Junior Convention auditions.
8. A student may apply for only one scholarship in the same year.
9. Musicianship/theory tests MUST be taken on festival day. The NFMC tests shall be used as a basis for State Scholarships.
10. Judges will be asked to name winners and first and second alternates for all scholarships.
11. Unless the highest standards of performance are met in the various classifications at state auditions, no winner will be declared.
12. A student must have participated in a NFMC Junior Festival prior to the year in which he/she competes for scholarships (not necessarily the year just prior to the year of competition), with exception for the Advanced Summer Music Center Scholarship.
13. A student may not win the same scholarship two years in a row. A student may not succeed himself as a winner, but may reapply after a minimum of one year's absence.
14. Students cannot transfer from one festival to another to audition for any scholarship.

One (1) scholarship, not to exceed \$1000.00 in tuition, in Piano, Strings, Instrumental or Voice is to be offered each year to any advanced Summer Music Center listed by the National Federation of Music Clubs (see following list). Auditions will be held on the day of the MFMC Junior Convention. Students must have already applied to the chosen camp in order to apply for the MFMC Scholarship. MFMC will send scholarship money to the Music Center upon acceptance.

Brevard Music Center-NC, Eastern Music Festival-NC, Sewanee Music Center-TN, Stephen Collins Foster Music Camp-KY, Aspen School of Music-CO, Marrowstone Music Festival-WA, Music Academy of the West-CA, Rock Ridge Music Center-CO, International Music Camp-ND, Orpheus Festival at Simpson College-IA, Ravinia Festival-IL, Junior Composers Institute-MN, Chautauqua Music School-NY, Interlochen Center for the Arts-MI, Kneisel Hall-ME, Meadowmount School of Music-NY, The Walden School, Ltd. REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicant must be a member of the MFMC Junior Division (club or Individual Member) in grades 10 – 12 (including graduating seniors).
2. Applicant must participate in a NFMC Junior Festival the year of application for the scholarship.
3. Applicant must play in VERY DIFFICULT CLASS I or above for Piano, DIFFICULT CLASS I or above for Strings, DIFFICULT CLASS for Instrumental, SENIOR CLASS III or above for Voice, and make SUPERIOR rating on performance the year of audition for this scholarship.
4. Applicant must make a SUPERIOR on Musicianship Theory Test Level VII or higher on or before the first year of application. After a Superior rating is achieved on the proper level NO further Musicianship Theory Test is required for future auditions for this particular scholarship. The Musicianship Theory Test MUST be taken on Festival Day.
5. Applicant must provide scores for the judges' use. PHOTOCOPIED MUSIC IS PROHIBITED!
6. Applicant must be prepared to perform both REQUIRED AND CHOICE FESTIVAL PIECES.
7. No other MFMC scholarship may be applied for in a given year.
8. Recipient may not win this scholarship 2 years in a row, but is eligible to re-apply after at least 1 year's absence.
9. Students cannot transfer from one festival to another to audition for any scholarship.
10. Applications for this scholarship will be accepted until April 1 of each year.
11. It is the responsibility of the teacher/counselor and student/parent/guardian to be familiar with any and all requirements of the chosen Music Center

Two (2) Scholarships will be offered each year in the state. Two winners from each District Festival may audition on the day of the MFMC Junior Convention. First and second alternates will also be chosen on that day. If the winner named is not able to accept the scholarship, he/she is to notify the Festival Chairman and the State Scholarship Chairman by April 1 of the year of competition.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicant must be a member of the MFMC Junior Division (club or Individual Member) in grades 9 – 12 (including graduating Seniors).
2. Applicant must have participated in a NFMC Junior Festival prior to the year of application for the scholarship. It does not necessarily have to be the year prior to the year of competition.
3. Applicant must play in DIFFICULT CLASS I or above and make SUPERIOR rating on performance the year of audition for this scholarship.
4. Applicant must make a minimum grade of EXCELLENT on Musicianship Theory Test Level V the first year of application. After a Superior rating is achieved on the proper level NO further Musicianship Theory Test is required for future auditions for this particular scholarship. The Musicianship Theory Test MUST be taken on Festival Day.
5. Applicant must provide scores for the judges' use. PHOTOCOPIED MUSIC IS PROHIBITED!
6. Applicant must be prepared to perform both REQUIRED AND CHOICE FESTIVAL PIECES.
7. No other MFMC scholarship may be applied for in a given year.
8. Recipient may not win this scholarship two years in a row, but is eligible to re-apply after a minimum of one year's absence.
9. Students cannot transfer from one festival to another to audition for any scholarship.

One Scholarship may be given in each Festival District in Piano or Voice. First and second alternates will be chosen on Festival Day. If the winner named is not able to accept the scholarship, he/she is to notify the Festival Chairman and the State Scholarship Chairman by May 1 of the year of competition.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicant must be a member of the MFMC Junior Division (club or Individual Member) in grades 7 – 12 (including graduating seniors).
2. Applicant must have participated in a NFMC Junior Festival prior to the year of application for the scholarship. It does not necessarily have to be the previous year.
3. Piano Applicant must enter in Medium Class or above and make a Superior Rating on performance the year of audition for the scholarship.
Voice Applicant must enter in Junior III Class or above and make a Superior Rating on performance the year of audition for the scholarship.
4. Applicant must take Musicianship Text IV and make a minimum of EXCELLENT the first year of application. If this scholarship is applied for again, he/she must take Musicianship Test IV again, but **must** receive a SUPERIOR RATING. After a Superior Rating is achieved on the proper level, no further Musicianship Test is required for this particular scholarship. The test must be taken on Festival Day.
5. Applicant will audition on Festival Day and will be expected to perform **both** Required and Choice Festival selections.
6. Applicant must provide scores for the judges' use. PHOTOCOPIED MUSIC IS PROHIBITED!
7. The winner of this scholarship is declared at each festival, on Festival Day. No further audition is required.
8. No other MFMC scholarship may be applied for in a given year.
9. Recipient may not win this scholarship two years in a row, but is eligible to re-apply after a minimum of one year's absence.
10. Students cannot transfer from one festival to another to audition for any scholarship.
